

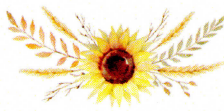

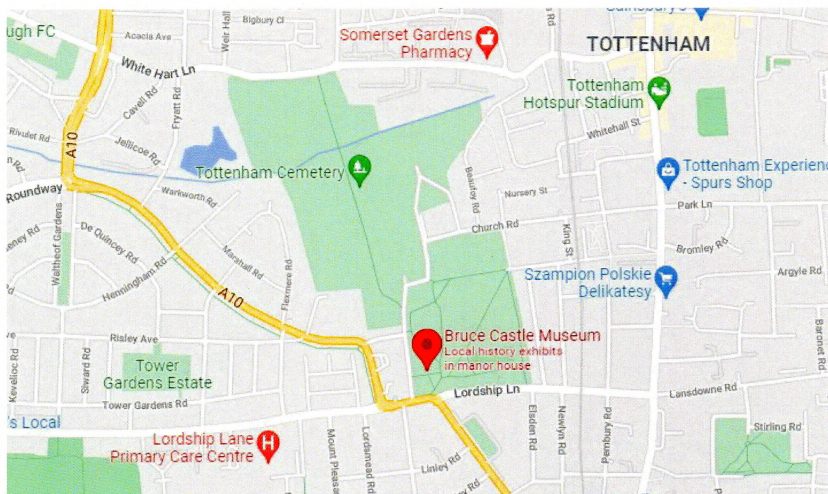
Once as I travelled through a quiet evening,
